RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS CELEBRATING IMPORTANT MILESTONES

In September of 1793, our nation's first president, George
Washington laid the cornerstone for the United States Capitol
Building. Meanwhile in upstate New York, the new Episcopal
parish of Christ's Church, Duanesburg had just been
incorporated. The new church building, paid for by James
Duane, was consecrated on August 21st by the Bishop of New
York, the Rt. Rev. Samuel Provoost.

Today, the original layout of the Christ's Church has not been significantly altered, which is the foundation for the building's historical significance today. The box pews with their locking doors, the balcony, and the central high pulpit with its sound-reflecting board remain remarkably unchanged since 1793.

However, over the years some things have changed at Christ's Church. A bell tower and steeple were added in 1811.

Electricity was installed in the early 20th century which provided electrical lighting and power to run the oil-fired heating system. Parishioners also arrive in the comfort of their modern cars these days and no longer travel to church by horse and cart, although our Carriage House could accommodate those who still wished to arrive in this old-fashioned manner!

In terms of worship and liturgy, much has also changed since 1793. The version of the Holy Bible we read each Sunday is now the New Revised Standard Version, published in 1989, replacing the King James Version, which was the first authorized English-language version of our scriptures, published in 1611. The first American Book of Common Prayer, published in 1798, has also been revised over the years to reflect modern language and usage, and to live into its

purpose of being the 'common' prayer book of the 'common' people. The current version in use today is the 1979 edition. The style of church music has also changed. Singing hymns was not officially approved until 1820, so congregations didn't really sing as we are accustomed until after that date.

On August 19th, as a celebration of the 225th Anniversary of Christ's Church, we are holding a "back to the future" service of Holy Communion using the text from the 1789 Prayer Book. The service will be similar to the Holy Eucharist Rite One, but with some important differences. As there were no female clergy ordained in 1793, our own Dcn. Debbie will not be serving. No acolytes will assist the "minister" and the service will be less "high church" in nature. However, the most essential things remain constant. Christ's Church, situated on the corner of Duanesburg Churches Road and Route 20, has been a witness for the last 225 years to the weary traveler, the early morning commuter and tourists who drive through our beautiful area. Let us pray that this congregation continues to gather in faith, fellowship, celebration and worship, following the example of our ancestors from 225 years ago, and continuing with our descendants into the foreseeable future.
